Materials

Yardages based on 42" wide *unwashed* fabric. Prewashing fabric may require additional yardage.

2/3 yd or 1 Panel (Y0756-3)
 1/2 yd Black Stripe (Y0757-3) (inc binding)
 1/2 yd Orange Stripe (Y0757-37)
 1/2 yd Yellow Plaid (Y0758-9)
 1/4 yd Orange Plaid (Y0758-37)
 5/8 yd Black/Pumpkin Toss (Y0759-3)
 1/2 yd Black Bats (Y0760-3)
 3/8 yd Green Bats (Y0760-24)
 3/8 yd Black Eyeballs (Y0761-3)
 1/8 yd Green Eyeballs (Y0761-24)
 1/8 yd Orange Eyeballs (Y0761-37)
 2-5/8 yds Backing of choice

Cut the Fabrics

WOF = Width of Fabric
 LOF = Length of Fabric

From the Panel fussy cut:

1 – 20-1/2" x 23" rectangle

From Black Stripe cut:

5 – 2-1/2" x WOF strips (binding)
 2 – 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles
 2 – 1-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles

From Orange Stripe cut:

2 – 2-1/2" x 23" rectangles
 2 – 2-1/2" x 24-1/2" rectangles
 1 – 2-1/2" x 30-1/2" rectangle

From Yellow Plaid cut:

14 – 2-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles
 26 – 2-7/8" squares
 2 – 1-1/2" x WOF strips

From Orange Plaid cut:

2 – 1-1/2" x WOF strips
 1 – 1-1/2" x 24" rectangle
 8 – 2-7/8" squares

From Black/Pumpkin Toss cut:

2 – 3-1/2" x 22" rectangles **LOF** - cut first
 2 – 4-3/4" x 30-1/2" WOF rectangles
 2 – 3-1/2" x 4-1/2" **LOF** rectangles

From Black Bats cut:

26 – 2-7/8" squares
 52 – 2-1/2" squares

From Green Bats cut:

2 – 1-1/2" x WOF strips
 1 – 1-1/2" x 24" rectangle
 1 – 2-1/2" x WOF strip
 8 – 2-7/8" squares

From Black Eyeballs cut:

2 – 1-1/2" x WOF strips
 1 – 3-1/2" x WOF strip
 14 – 2-1/2" squares

From Green Eyeballs cut:

6 – 2-1/2" squares

From Orange Eyeballs cut:

7 – 2-1/2" squares

Directions

Panel (Center)

1. Sew 2-1/2" x 23" Orange Stripe rectangles to the right and left sides of the panel; press toward the rectangles. Sew 2-1/2" x 24-1/2" Orange Stripe rectangles to the top and bottom of the panel section; press toward the rectangles.
2. Sew a 1-1/2" x 3-1/2" Black Stripe rectangle to the bottom of a 3-1/2" x 4-1/2" Black/Pumpkin Toss rectangle. Sew 3-1/2" x 22" Black/Pumpkin Toss to stripe; press. Sew to left side of center panel; press. Sew a 1-1/2" x 3-1/2" Black Stripe rectangle to top of 3-1/2" x 4-1/2" Black/Pumpkin Toss rectangle. Sew 3-1/2" x 22" Black/Pumpkin Toss to stripe; press. Sew to right side of center panel; press.
3. Sew 4-3/4" x 30-1/2" Black/Pumpkin Toss rectangles to the top and bottom of the center; press. Add the 2-1/2" x 30-1/2" Orange Stripe rectangle to the top of the center; press. The quilt center should measure 30-1/2" x 37-1/2".

Block #1 – Churn Dash – Strip Piece Method

1. Make the block center: Sew a 1-1/2" x WOF Green Bats strip to a 1-1/2" x WOF Orange Plaid strip (Fig. 1); press. Add a 2-1/2" x WOF Green Bats, a 1-1/2" x WOF Orange Plaid and a 1-1/2" x WOF Green Bats to this strip set; press. Cut the strip set into four 5-1/2" slices (5-1/2" x 6-1/2" sections).
2. Make the block ends: Sew a 1-1/2" x 24" Green Bats strip to a 1-1/2" x 24" Orange Plaid strip; press. Cut the strip set into eight 2-1/2" slices (2-1/2" x 2-1/2" sections).
3. Make the half-square triangle corner squares: Place a 2-7/8" Green Bats square right sides together on a 2-7/8" Orange Plaid square. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner; sew two seams, stitching 1/4" on each side of the drawn line (Fig 2). Cut apart on the drawn line and press to create 2 half-square triangle corner squares. Repeat to make a total of 16 corner squares.
4. Sew a 2-1/2" square block end section between two half-square triangle corners (Fig 3); press. Arrange block sections and sew together in rows; press. Make a total of four Churn Dash blocks.
5. Sew a 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" Black Stripe rectangle to one short side of a Churn Dash block (Fig 4); press toward the rectangle. Sew another Churn Dash block to the other side of the Black Stripe rectangle; press as before. Repeat to make a total of two 2-block units.

Block #2 – Star Blocks

1. Place a 2-7/8" Black Bat square on top of a 2-7/8" Yellow Plaid square. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner; sew two seams, stitching 1/4" on each side of the drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line and press to create two half-square triangle star points. Repeat to make 52 star points total.
2. Arrange star points with 2-1/2" Green and Orange Eyeball squares for centers and Black Bat squares for corners (Fig 5); sew together in rows. You need 6 Star Blocks with Green Eyeball centers and 7 with Orange Eyeball centers.

Picket Fence – Strip Piece Method

1. Sew a 1-1/2" WOF Black Eyeballs strip to a 1-1/2" WOF Yellow Plaid strip; press. Add another 1-1/2" Black Eyeball strip (Fig 6), another 1-1/2" yellow Plaid strip and a 3-1/2" WOF Black Eyeball strip; press. Cut the strip set into fourteen 1-1/2" slices (1-1/2" x 7-1/2" sections).
2. Pickets: Place a 2-1/2" Black Eyeballs square right sides together on one end of a 2-1/2" x 7-1/2" Yellow Plaid picket rectangle. Position the Black Eyeballs print vertically as shown. Draw a diagonal line (Fig 7) on the square from lower left corner to upper right corner, stitch on the line and trim seam to 1/4"; press. Make a total of 14 Picket Fence sections.
3. Alternating picket sections with strip set slices from Step 1, sew into one long row (see quilt image).

Putting It Together

1. Referring to the color quilt image, sew five star blocks in a row, alternating center block colors. Sew to the top edge of the quilt center; press.
2. For the side borders, sew Star Blocks to Churn Dash blocks, referring to the quilt image for placement.
3. Add the picket fence section to the bottom of the quilt center; press.
4. Layer and quilt as desired. Apply the binding, and label to finish.






