Finished Quilt Size 87¹/₄" x 87¹/₄"

All strips are cut across the width of the fabric from selvage edge to selvage edge.
Do not include any portion of the selvage in the pieces cut for the quilt.

Cutting Instructions:




Style #6005-2 1³/₄ yds.
Black Stripe
Cut eight strips 7" wide for the outer border.

Style #6004-2 3/4 yd.
Small Black Fern
Cut two strips 11¹/₂" wide.
From these strips, cut four squares 11¹/₂" x 11¹/₂" and five squares 3" x 3".



Style #6006-1 3/4 yd.
Dark Pink Floral
Cut eight strips 3" wide for the inner border.



Style #6000-2 3/4 yd.
Large Black Floral
Cut two strips 11¹/₂" wide.
From these strips, cut four squares 11¹/₂" x 11¹/₂" and four squares 7" x 7".



Style #6010-2 3/4 yd.
Small Black Polka Dots
Cut eight strips 2¹/₄" wide for the binding.

Style #6001-2 1¹/₄ yds.
Black Paisley
Cut three strips 11⁷/₈" wide. From these strips, cut eight squares 11⁷/₈" x 11⁷/₈", two squares 3³/₈" x 3³/₈", and two squares 2³/₄" x 2³/₄". Cut each square once on the diagonal to make two triangles.



Style #6007-11 1⁵/₈ yds.
Orange Texture
Cut sixteen strips 3" wide.



These strips provide a great place to make-it-you with embellishment. Some ideas include beading, embroidery, appliqué, etc. Cut your strips ¹/₄" wider for heavy embroidery and trim to size after embellishing.

Cut strips 1 7/8" wide for the log cabin blocks. The individual logs are sized as follows:

Logs 1-4, 1 7/8" x 3 1/4" Logs 9-12, 1 7/8" x 8 3/4"


Logs 5-8, 1 7/8" x 6" Logs 13-14, 1 7/8" x 11 1/2"

The style numbers are listed in the diagram below to produce the quilt pictured on the cover.

Make the Log Cabin Blocks:

Choose two 3 1/4" long fabric pieces for the center of a log cabin block. Sew the two pieces together on their longer sides to make one block center. Repeat to make a total of sixteen block centers.

Add the remaining fabrics in the order shown in the diagram below. Make a total of sixteen log cabin blocks.



Repeat the fabric placements in every block or mix them up. There is sufficient fabric for all possible combinations.



Cut one 1 7/8" wide strip from each fabric to start. Addition each fabric in different positions in the log cabin block. You can cut more strips as needed once you have your blocks planned.

Quilt Assembly:

- 1 Make one four-square unit as shown.



Repeat three times.



You can place the log cabin blocks as shown or place the lighter values toward the outer edges or mix up the squares in other ways.

- 2 Make one log cabin triangle unit as shown.



Repeat to make eight units.

Measure the sides of your four-square units and the short sides of your log cabin triangle units. Enter this measurement here_____. Cut a piece this long from each strip of Style #6007-11 for the sashing.



If you are embroidering these strips, do the embroidery first, then trim the strip to the right length.

4 Using the quilt pictured as a guide, assemble the quilt's components into diagonal rows.

Style #6001-2

Join the diagonal rows together. Sew a $2\frac{3}{4}$ " triangle of Style #6001-2 to each corner to complete the body of the quilt top.

Borders:



Style #6006-1

1

Trim the selvages from the 3" wide strips of Style #6006-1, and sew two of them together to make a long 3" wide strip. Repeat three times to make a total of four strips.

Trim the selvages from the 7" wide strips of Style #6005-2, and sew two of them together to make a long 7" wide strip. Repeat three times to make a total of four strips.



Style #6005-2

Lay the quilt top out on a hard, flat surface like a large table top or a clean floor. Lay one long 3" wide strip on top of the quilt top with the long edge flush with one edge of the quilt top and the short edge even with the adjacent edge of the quilt top. Cut the strip even with the opposite edge of the quilt top. Cut a second 3" strip the same length as the first.

4

Measure the length of one of your trimmed 3" strips and enter this measurement here_____. Sew one trimmed strip to the left-hand side of the quilt top and one to the right-hand side of the quilt top.

5

Add 5" to the measurement in step 4 above and enter that number here_____. From each of the two remaining long 3" wide strips, cut a strip this length. From each of the long 7" wide strips of Style #6005-2, cut one strip the same length.

6

Sew one of the trimmed 3" strips to one of the trimmed 7" strips. Repeat once to make two border units. Sew one unit to the top and one to the bottom of the quilt top.


Sew a 7" square of Style #6000-2 to each short end of the two remaining 7" wide border strips. Sew one border strip to the left-hand side and one to the right-hand side of the quilt top.



Style #6000-2

Backing:

Determine the length and width of your completed quilt top by measuring through the center of the quilt top in each direction. The quilt backing needs to be six inches wider and six inches longer than the completed quilt top. If your top measures $87\frac{3}{4}$ " x $87\frac{3}{4}$ " including the seam allowances on the outer edges of the quilt top, then your backing needs to be $93\frac{3}{4}$ " x $93\frac{3}{4}$ ".



Style #6002-2

Suggested Backing 7 yds.

From the backing fabric, cut two panels each $93\frac{3}{4}$ " long (if your measurements are different, cut to fit your quilt top). From the remaining yardage, cut three 13" x 42" strips. Remove the selvages from the three strips and the two panels. Sew the three strips together end to end to make one long 13" strip. Trim this long strip to 13" x $93\frac{3}{4}$ ". Sew a $93\frac{3}{4}$ " long panel to each long side of the 13" wide strip. Press the seams toward the panels.

Finishing:

1

Layer the completed quilt top with batting and backing, and quilt as desired.

2

Trim the finished quilt, and bind as desired using the $2\frac{1}{4}$ " wide strips of Style #6010-2.
