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Finshed Quilt Size: 36" x 36"

Be sure to read through instructions before beginning. Cutting instructions include 1/4" seam allowance. Yardage is based on 42" of usable fabric width. All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) unless otherwise stated. Press all seams as you assemble your blocks. Border lengths given are exact measure ments. You may want to cut borders slightly longer to allow for variations in seams and mitering corners.

7/8 yard

A. (5) 6 1/2" square fussy cut directional on point.

M. (2) 4 1/2" x 27 3/4" strip

N. (2) 4 1/2" x 35 3/4" strip

1/2 yard

B. (16) 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" strip

O. (4) 2 1/4" x WOF binding

Hilltop Blue 104.101.03

3/8 yard

C. (1) 9 3/4" square sub-cut twice diagonally

D. (4) 5 1/8" square sub-cut twice diagonally

Music Room Blue 104.101.06

E. (4) 1 1/2" square

3/8 yard

F. (2) 5 5/8" square sub-cut twice diagonally

G. (2) 1" x 20 1/4" strip

H. (2) 1" x 21 1/4" strip

K. (2) 1" x 26 3/4" strip

L. (2) 1" x 27 3/4" strip

Queen Anne's Lace Ivory 104.101.04 1/2 yard

I. (2) 3 1/4" x 21 1/4" strip

J. (2) 3 1/4" x 26 3/4" strip

Backing Hilltop Red 104.101.03 1 1/4 yards

(1) 44" x 45"

Quilt Center

With images of fussy cut A squares right-reading on point, sew a B strip to the upper left and lower right edges of (1) A square on point. Sew (1) A square on point, right-reading to upper left and the lower right edges of B-A-B set. Continue building ends and sew (1) B strip to each end of the set and then sew (1) D triangle to each end of the set. Press seams toward the B strips. This os the diagonal middle section of the quilt.





Sew (1) F triangle to each end of the strip set, with base of triangle facing up and out. Press seam toward B. Repeat to make (2) sets.

With images of fussy cut A squares, right-reading on point, sew B strip to the upper left and lower right edges of (1) A square on point. Sew (1) C triangle to each end of B-A-B set (refer to diagram for proper triangle placement). Press seams toward B strips. Repeat to make another C-B-A-B-C set.

Sew (1) F triangle to each end of (1) B strip, with base of triangle facing up and out. Sew this strip to the base of (1) D triangle. Repeat.

Quilt Center Assembly

Layout quilt center sets in diagonal rows. Sew the rows together. The quilt center should be 19 3/4" square. Trim to square if needed.



Borders

Sew (1) G strip to right and left sides of the quilt center, press seam toward G. Trim even with quilt center. Sew (1) H strip to the top and bottom of the guilt center, press seam toward H. Trim even with quilt center.

Repeat adding borders as above in the following order.

I strips: left and right J strips: top and bottom K strips: left and right L strips: top and bottom M strips: left and right N strips: top and bottom

Finishing

Layer quilt top, batting and backing piece, wrong sides of fabrics both toward batting and baste. Hand quilt, machine quilt or tie as desired. Sew binding strips together into one continuous strip, iron in half lengthwise and sew to raw edge of quilt top.
