Advanced Beginner Level

All border strip length measurements are approximate. Please measure your quilt top before cutting the length of each border.

Fabric A: 2-1/3 yards of AKC-7937-200

Fabric B: 3-1/8 yards of AKC-7941-200

Fabric C: 1-1/2 yards of AKC-7939-200

Fabric D: 1/2 yard of AKC-7940-200

Fabric E: 1/3 yard of AKC-7942-200

Fabric F: 1 yard of AKC-7944-200

Fabric G: 1/2 yard of AKC-7944-172

Fabric H: 1-3/4 yards of AKC-7943-200

Backing: 6 yards of your choice

Antique Version

Fabric A: 2-1/3 yards of AKC-7937-199

Fabric B: 3-1/8 yards of AKC-7941-199

Fabric C: 1-1/2 yards of AKC-7939-199

Fabric D: 1/2 yard of AKC-7940-199

Fabric E: 1/3 yard of AKC-7942-199

Fabric F: 1 yard of AKC-7944-172

Fabric G: 1/2 yard of AKC-7938-199

Fabric H: 1-3/4 yards of AKC-7943-199

Backing: 6 yards of your choice

Fabric A: Cut eighty 2-1/2" squares, eighty 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" strips and (160) 4-1/2" squares.

Fabric B: Cut forty 4-7/8" squares and eighty 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" strips.

Fabric C: Cut forty 4-7/8" squares. Cut nine 2-1/4" x width of fabric (WOF) strips for the binding.

Fabric D: Cut eighty 2-1/2" squares.

Fabric E: Cut ten 4-1/2" squares.

Fabric F: Cut eighty 2-1/2" squares. Cut nine 2" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together into two 2" x 80-1/2" strips and two 2" x 67-1/2" strips.

Fabric G: Cut eighty 2-1/2" squares.

Fabric H: Cut ten 4-1/2" squares. Cut nine 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together into two 4-1/2" x 83-1/2" strips and two 4-1/2" x 75-1/2" strips.

Assembly Instructions:

- 1) Place one 2-1/2" Fabric F square on top left side of one 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" Fabric A rectangle, right sides together (fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (fig. 2).
- 2) Place another 2-1/2" Fabric F square on top right side of the Fabric A rectangle, right sides together (fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (fig. 4) to make one A/F Flying Goose Unit. Repeat to make forty A/F Flying Goose Units.
- 3) Repeat Steps 1 and 2 to make forty 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" A/G Flying Geese Units and eighty 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" A/B Flying Geese Units.
- 4) Place one 4-7/8" Fabric B square on top of one 4-7/8" Fabric C square, right sides together. Draw a diagonal line through the center of the top block (Fig. 5). Sew 1/4" away from the drawn diagonal line on each side (Fig. 5).
- 5) Cut the squares across the drawn diagonal line to make two half-square triangles (Fig. 6). Open each half-square triangle formed and press. Repeat to make eighty B/C half-square triangles.
- 6) Place one 2-1/2" Fabric D square on the Fabric C corner of one half-square triangle. Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square using the same technique used to make the flying geese above. Repeat with the remaining half-square triangles to make eighty corner squares.
- 7) Follow the block layouts to make ten Block A squares and ten Block B squares.
- 8) Refer to the quilt photo and sew together four blocks into one row. Make five rows. Sew the rows together to make the quilt top.
- 9) Sew one 2" x 80-1/2" Inner Border strips to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 2" x 67-1/2" Inner Border to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
- 10) Sew one 4-1/2" x 83-1/2" Outer Border to the quilt top. Sew one 4-1/2" x 75-1/2" Outer Border to the quilt top.
- 10) Layer, quilt and bind as desired.

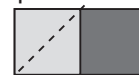

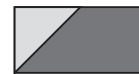

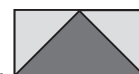


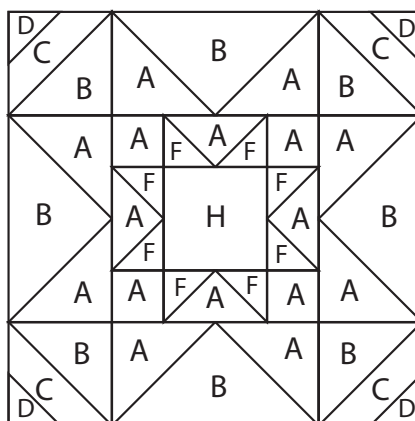

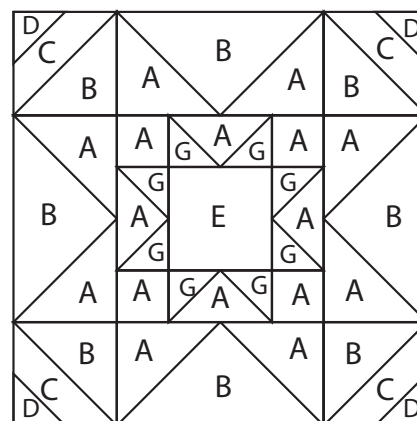
